

INTRODUCTION

Do not try to operate the Execulator until you have read the directions carefully. Damage due to improper use could have little if no effect on the warranty of your unit. However, with proper care this unit could last you a lifetime or until discarded, lost or given to a troubled friend. Exercise caution utilizing the calculator around school aged children. This unit once mastered could relieve the anxiety of said children and provide easier, less complicated avenues for higher education contrary to their teachings. Keep out of the reach of pets, (this could prove fatal to your Execulator). If you are left handed and receive a right handed unit - learn to use your right hand and vice versa. If you are ambidextrous - disregard this paragraph.

RELIABILITY - completely solid state with no functioning parts. No batteries necessary, no AC no DC.



OPERATION

Hold your Execulator in your right hand with the display facing up.
This is the front of the unit.
Insert your fingers and thumb in the holes from the back. Notice that the back is opposite of the front. The large hole is for your thumb (you may quickly identify this hole since it is bigger than the small holes). Now you are ready to operate your Execulator.

For addition you count from your index finger to the right, for example - 1, 2, 3, 4, etc.

For subtraction you count to your left, for example - etc, 4, 3, 2, 1.

MULTIPLICATION & DIVISION

For multiplication and division you count as many times as you need. Please refrain from long hours of constant use or counting too fast to avoid jamming your Execulator. To clear any entry, remove all fingers and also your thumb.

MEMORY

The hole with the string is your memory control ...please try to remember this.

IN CASE OF DIFFICULTY

If you have any problem with the previous functions of your Execulator please make sure you have removed it from the box.

Verify that all fingers (and thumb too) are correctly inserted. If you have trouble reading the display move to more adequate lighting. If you left your execulator within the reach of a pet - buy another one. If you jam your unit wait until the swelling goes down and clear the unit (see Page 7). If none of the above suggestions correct the problem give up.

WARRANTY

Your Execulator calculating machine complete with memory is warranted for about one full year from date of ?. The owner is thereby responsible for the repair and/or care of all moving parts and agrees to maintain same without charge for labor or parts.
