The Super StumpersTM word cartridge for grades 6 thru 8 adds 125 words to the *Speak & Spell*TM unit's built-in word list. With this cartridge, your child can practice the spelling of difficult words. The Super Stumpers activity book provides your child with challenging enrichment exercises.

For a seventh or eighth grader, good communication skills are vital. Because of the emphasis on verbal and written communication, development of a growing spelling vocabulary is essential. The Super StumpersTM 6 thru 8 word cartridge, designed to work with the *Speak & Spell*TM talking learning aid, encourages development of a spelling vocabulary while improving communication skills.

The 125 words in the Super Stumpers alculator Museum 6 thru 8 cartridge are divided into four levels of increasing difficulty. The words in the cartridge are difficult to spell because they involve:

- Silent letters such as receipt
- Irregular spellings such as acre
- Multiple spellings for the same sound, such as ie and y for e
- Suffixes that require a variety of changes to the root word, such as y to i, doubling consonants, or dropping an e

The Super Stumpers 6 thru 8 activity book offers your child additional practice in spelling difficult words that he or she can play alone or with friends. Some activities can be played without the Speak & SpellTM unit and some require additional materials, such as markers, paper and pencil, or crayons.

The directions for each activity explain what your child needs for the activity.

Spelunker Spelling (pages 2-3)—A cave exploration acquaints your child with a variety of language activities.

Spell for Par (page 4)—With this activity, your child can spell words to win a game of miniature golf.

Reporting for Hollywood (page 5)— This activity provides your child with practice in adding -ing to a variety of one words and using them in sentences. (Note: the answer for "drown" is one of the control of the contr

Around the World in 40 Words (pages 6-7)—This activity encourages your child to spell difficult words while competing with other players. Your child may want to use a dictionary to check spelling and word usage.

Head for Home (page 8)—This activity emphasizes the spelling of words with silent letters and fosters your child's vocabulary. When your child successfully completes the activity, the answer is "Space Station."

Double Bubble Crossword Puzzle (page 9)—This activity helps strengthen your child's vocabulary while helping him or her learn the spelling rule "The vowel before a double consonant usually has a short sound."

Put Yourself in the Center Ring (pages 10-11)—This game lets your child practice spelling words with r-controlled sounds. When complete, the message in the center reads "You are a performer."

Untangle the Jewels (page 12)—This activity lets your child practice recognizing the "l" sound when it is at the end of a word. The jewels remaining in the Sheik's jewel box are a diamond, an opal, a ruby, an emerald, and a sapphire.

Let's Chart Your Progress! (Inside Back Cover)—Your child can use a bar graph to record spelling progress and accomplishments.

Additional Activities

Your child may wish to expand the activities in the Super Stumpers 6 thru 8 book by:

- Playing "Spell for Par" on all levels
- Making his or her own list of ''super stumpers'' and trying to find them in a newspaper

Note: Remind your child to press the ERASE key after "decoding" each word with the SECRET CODE key in all activities except "Spell for Par." The Super Stumpers 6 thru 8 word cartridge vocabulary is divided into four levels of increasing difficulty. To access the cartridge word list, press the # Module/Cartridge Select key when the cartridge is in the unit. Press this key again to return to the unit's built-in word list.

The Speak & Spell electronic learning aid includes several basic operations that provide your child with enjoyable, educational activities.

Spell [04]

The we key activates the unit. Four tones let you know the device is ON and working—the display shows "Spell A." Four levels of difficulty are available and selected by pressing , , , , , or when the display shows "SPELL A." "SPELL A" means that the Speak & Spell learning aid is ready and will select words from the Level A list. Difficulty increases from Level A through Level D (see "Word List").

GO ∞

Press to begin. You are directed to "Spell ___." Then press the letter keys to spell the word.

ENTER 1

When you have finished spelling the word, press the **1 ENTER** key to have the spelling checked.

If the spelling is correct, you are praised and asked to spell a new word. If the spelling is incorrect, you are asked to try again. If the second attempt is incorrect, the word is pronounced and the correct spelling shown.

After each group of ten words, the display shows you the score. The voice tells you how many words you spelled correctly on the first try and how many were misspelled.

REPLAY 2

The REPLAY key provides you with the same list of ten words again. (Pressing starts a list of ten new words.)

REPEAT ["

If you want to hear a word again, press
REPEAT.

ERASE S USEUM

If you make a mistake or want to try again before pressing TENTER, press SERASE.

SAY IT

Pressing the SAY IT key starts the SAY IT, SPELL IT activity. The display shows "SAY IT A." You can select another level of difficulty by pressing , c, or . This activity is designed to provide practice in reading, pronouncing, and spelling words.

Press to begin. A word appears in the display, and the voice instructs you to "say it." After a short pause so that you can say the word, the word is pronounced. A new word then appears. After ten words have been pronounced, the unit directs you to spell the same ten words. The spelling operation and scoring are the same as in the spelling activity.

LETTER 3

Press the ☑ LETTER key. A letter appears and is pronounced. Letters are randomly selected each time ☑ LETTER is pressed.

SECRET CODE 1

Press the **1** SECRET CODE key to code or decode words and phrases. Simply press **1**, type in a word, press **1** ENTER, and the word is coded. Or press **1**, type in a coded word, press **1** ENTER, and the word is decoded.

MYSTERY WORD ?

Press the 7 MYSTERY WORD key and a word from level C or D is selected. Dashes appear for each letter in the word. Guess a letter by pressing a letter key. If the letter you enter is one of the letters in the mystery word, tones sound, and the letter appears in its correct position. If the letter is not one of the letters in the mystery word, it counts as an incorrect guess. After seven incorrect letter guesses, the correct word is displayed.

CLUE =

Used with the **Mystery Word** game, the CLUE key can be pressed to get one letter of the mystery word and its position. Using the CLUE key counts as two incorrect guesses in your score.

The \(\rangle \) key is used to place an apostrophe in the display.

Additional word lists expand the available vocabulary. These cartridges fit into the back of the *Speak & Spell* electronic learning aid. Consult your dealer for information on cartridge availability.

Cartridge Select/Module Select

When a cartridge is in place, pressing ## Cartridge Select accesses the new word list. Press the ## Cartridge Select key again, and the unit returns to the built-in word list. If you press the ## Cartridge Select key and a cartridge is not in place, nothing happens. Note: Some units are labeled ## Module Select, which has the same function as ## Cartridge Select.


One additional key deserves special attention. **OFF** turns the unit OFF. Note that to conserve batteries, the *Speak & Spell* electronic learning aid is designed to automatically turn itself off after approximately five minutes of non-use. However, considerable battery life can be saved if the unit is turned off promptly after use.

With the proper care and maintenance of the unit, the Speak & Spell electronic learning aid can provide years of educational enjoyment for your child. Installing batteries is simple and easy. You can also purchase an AC Adapter to conserve batteries or an earphone to use for private listening.

Battery Information

Remove the battery compartment door by prying gently with a key, coin, or similar object. Be sure to insert the batteries as shown in the picture on the floor of the battery compartment.

Use Alkaline Batteries Only. Four "C" Cells Required.



Low Battery Information

The Speak & Spell electronic learning aid provides approximately 15 hours of actual use when using alkaline batteries. If you observe any of the following indications, the batteries should be replaced.

- Imprecise word pronunciation or unusual and unexpected sounds or tones



You can install a word cartridge quickly and easily. Carefully read this information before installing a cartridge.


Cartridge Information

The batteries must be removed before inserting or removing a word cartridge. When inserting a word cartridge into your *Speak & Spell* learning aid, be sure to press the cartridge in as far as it will go. This ensures that the battery compartment door will close correctly.

Important: Be sure to hold the cartridge with the label visible when inserting cartridge (see illustration). Firm pressure may be required to insert the cartridge the first time.



If you have problems, remove and insert the cartridge one or two times to ensure that the cartridge connects properly with the *Speak & Spell* learning aid.
